The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

A portion of the moneys hereby appropriated shall be transferred to the state student financial aid audit account (FA) special revenue fund in an amount sufficient to support spending in the account.

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Notwithstanding any other provision of law, during the fiscal year commencing April 1, 2009, additional awards due and payable to eligible students for accelerated study shall be deferred until October 1, 2010. Such additional awards shall be adjusted on a pro rata basis pursuant to section 667 of the education law. However, nothing contained herein shall prevent the payment 48 of such awards prior to October 1, 2010 49 should additional funds be provided therefor [838,966,000]
