Written Testimony to the New York State Division of the Budget on Behalf of the Suffolk County School Superintendents Association (SCSSA) and the Long Island Education Coalition (LIEC) – November 30, 2007

Good afternoon, my name is Gary Bixhorn and I am pleased to have the opportunity to offer testimony on behalf of the Suffolk County School Superintendents Association (SCSSA) as well as the Long Island Education Coalition (LIEC). The Suffolk County School Superintendents Association represents the Chief School Administrators of the 69 school districts in Suffolk County. The Long Island Education Coalition includes all of the major membership groups representing parents, teachers, school board members, and administrators from the 125 school districts and the three BOCES on Long Island. The LIEC has a history of working closely with the Long Island business community through a longstanding relationship with the Long Island Association (LIA).

Both of the organizations I represent continue to have serious concerns about the allocation of state aid to New York State schools, and specifically, the school districts on Long Island. The facts make it very clear that Long Island schools are far more dependent on local property taxes to fund our programs than schools in other regions of the state. In fact, Long Islanders spend 20% more of their gross household income on property taxes than New Yorkers in general. The overdependence on property taxes corresponds with the lower share of revenues our districts receive from the state. According to the most recent school property tax report cards, 79% (95) of the school districts on Long Island receive less than 30% of revenues from the state. In fact, 38 school districts on Long Island receive less than 10% of their revenues from the state and the aggregate property tax levy for Long Island schools accounts for 70% of all school revenues. Only five Long Island school districts receive more than 50% of their funding through state aid.

Of course, looking at revenue tells only part of the story. Many believe that the cost of education is excessive on Long Island. However, the facts indicate a very different

reality. After accounting for regional cost differences within the state, the per pupil cost of education on Long Island is below the cost in the region at the median. This really should not be surprising when you consider the demographics of our region. We have many students enrolled in school districts with a combined wealth ratio below the state average, in fact approximately one-half of the 260,000 students in Suffolk County are in such districts. Overall, on Long Island, over one-third of all students are in such districts. If, as we are recommending, the wealth measures were adjusted to account for regional differences, these percentages would be far greater.

Our longstanding concern about the level of state support for our school districts, regional cost differences, and unreliable wealth measures has fueled our multi-year advocacy effort to reform the formula for the distribution of state aid. We advocated for a Foundation Formula with a regional cost index, a minimum level of state support, as well as increased funding levels. Unfortunately, while elements of our proposals were incorporated into the new Foundation Formula, the formula did not generate the desired outcome for our school districts. In fact, had it not been for the establishment of High Tax Aid during last year's state budget deliberations, dependence on local property taxes would have been far greater for our school districts.

The Foundation Formula as implemented did not work for many Long Island school districts. Specifically, in Suffolk County, 42 school districts only received the 3% minimum increase in Foundation Aid because the formula did not adequately recognize local effort, wealth, and regional cost differences. Among the 42 districts that received the minimum, nine have a Combined Wealth Ratio below 1.0. These nine school districts enroll 66,000 students. Overall, 63 school districts on Long Island received only the minimum increase.

Due to these issues involving the Foundation Formula, the need for a categorical aid that recognized the extraordinary local tax effort of Long Island property taxpayers was immediately apparent. Recognition of this need resulted in the establishment of High Tax Aid. High Tax Aid generated over \$70 million dollars to Long Island school districts.

At the same time, the total increase in Foundation Aid was \$100 million. When you consider the base upon which the Foundation Aid increase was generated and compare that to the increase generated through the High Tax Aid formula, the significance of this categorical aid is obvious. In fact, 78 school districts on Long Island can attribute more of their 2007-08 state aid increase to High Tax Aid than Foundation Aid.

Given the situation, the SCSSA and the LIEC are extremely concerned about the Foundation Formula as it now stands as well as the recent 2008-2009 proposal of the Board of Regents. We know that the Foundation Formula was originally conceptualized by the New York State Education Department and that the formula is rooted in past Regents proposals. For that reason, the most recent Regents state aid proposal adds to our concern. The proposal calls for the elimination of High Tax Aid that has proven so important to Long Island schools and taxpayers. The proposal also calls for the elimination of supplemental special education aid which provides significant financial support for services offered by Long Island school districts. In addition, it calls for the reduction of the 3% minimum Foundation Aid increase to a 2% minimum increase. We estimate that these proposed changes could result in the loss of as much as \$90 million to Long Island schools. The loss of any state support for Long Island schools cannot be justified. The facts already prove that we are far too heavily dependent on local property tax revenues. The loss of any state support would lead to greater property tax dependence and, in all likelihood, reduced programs.

Instead we should be considering changes to the formula that will generate more appropriate levels of state support for Long Island schools. A regional cost factor in the formula that better reflects the true cost of doing business on Long Island is essential. A better measure of local effort than the existing sharing ratio that accurately accounts for the level of funding that can reasonably be expected from a community must be established. Wealth and poverty measures that reflect regional cost differences will provide a more realistic picture of the region. Finally, minimum increases for all districts should be set at 5%, while minimum increases for low-wealth districts should be higher. Many of these proposals were advanced last year after the initial Foundation Formula

proposal was released. The LIA and LIEC issued a report in March 2007 that outlined several specific recommendations. We continue to believe that these recommendations should be implemented.

I have provided you with draft copies of the "Funding Facts" reports prepared by the LIEC and the SCSSA that served as the basis of this testimony. I would be pleased to arrange a follow-up conversation with representatives of both groups if you wish to pursue our ideas or discuss these issues.

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2007- 08 Long Island School Funding Facts: Foundation Aid & High Tax Aid

The following facts related to Long Island school funding are based upon an analysis of data from the 2007-08 Property Tax Report Cards and school aid estimates published by New York State. The data is presented in the attached tables.

Regional information concerning costs, salaries, and local efforts are drawn from the 2006 Long Island Association (LIA) publication, *Innovate* Long Island and associated research. All references to "Tables" and "Appendices" in the bullets refer to this publication, which is available on the Eastern Suffolk BOCES website at www.esboces.org.

2007-08 School Funding

■ Last year Long Island school districts received approximately a \$101 million increase in Foundation Aid and a \$70 million increase in High Tax Aid. If, as proposed by the Board of Regents, High Tax Aid is eliminated and the 3% minimum increase in Foundation Aid is cut to 2%, Long Island school districts could lose nearly \$77 million this year.

SUCH A LOSS WOULD BE DISASTROUS FOR CHILDREN AND THE TAXPAYERS OF LONG ISLAND. HIGH TAX AID MUST BE RETAINED.

The Foundation Formula "didn't work" for 63 of 121* school districts on Long Island. Those districts received the 3% minimum increase in Foundation Aid because other variables within the formula did not generate an increase. Among those 63 school districts are 9 which were below the state average for wealth, enrolling nearly 66,000 students.

The 58 school districts that received an increase in Foundation Aid above the 3% minimum are both high and low wealth. Just 30% (17) had a combined wealth ratio below 1.0 while the other 70% (41) were all above 1.0.

THE FOUNDATION FORMULA MUST BE FIXED.

LIEC

The establishment of High Tax Aid was critically important to all school districts but especially those that received the minimum increase in Foundation Aid.

NEARLY TWO-THIRDS (78) OF ALL LONG ISLAND SCHOOL DISTRICTS RECEIVED A GREATER INCREASE IN HIGH TAX AID THAN IN FOUNDATION AID.

Only five districts on Long Island (Brentwood, Hempstead, Roosevelt, William Floyd, and Wyandanch) receive a state share of funding over 50% of the budget. Nearly one-third of all districts (38) receive less than 10% of their budget in state aid. Just under one-half (57) receive between 10% and 30% of their budget in state aid.

WE CONTINUE TO ADVOCATE FOR A MINIMUM STATE SHARE OF FUNDING FOR ALL DISTRICTS.

- Within the Foundation Formula, increases in aid for special education services were capped. Expense-driven excess cost aid in the amount of \$291 million was incorporated in the base Foundation Aid. Traditionally, increases in aid tied to increasing costs for these mandated services were provided to districts; their increases are now capped within the formula.
- The total enrollment of the 125 school districts on Long Island is 471,938. This includes 26 school districts with a combined wealth ratio below the state average (1.0). Enrollment in these districts is 161,127 or 34% of all students on Long Island.

THE PERCEPTION OF WEALTH ON LONG ISLAND CONTINUES TO DIFFER FROM THE REALITY.

Local Effort/Disposable Income

A Long Island worker earning the regional median wage, purchasing a median-priced home and financing that house over 30 years, has far less disposable income than wage earners in other regions of the state.

Disposable income for a Long Island median wage homeowner is less than 1% of wages earned. Disposable income for such workers in other regions ranges from 14% to 57% of the median wage (This calculation does not include the cost of property taxes.)

- Long Islanders use an average of about 20% more of their gross household incomes to pay their residential school property taxes than New Yorkers in general (see Appendix D).
 - As Long Island's regionally adjusted per pupil expenditures are approximately 6.6% less than those for New York State, this greater than average effort is required due to Long Island's share of state aid (see Table 12 and Appendix D).
- * STAR subsidies to certain residential property owners on Long Island amounted to nearly \$641 million. If these STAR subsidies had been paid directly to school districts in the form of state aid, the amount of funds that school districts needed to raise from local property taxes and other revenues would have decreased by nearly \$641 million or more than 11%. STAR subsidies provide no school tax relief for commercial property owners (see Table 16).

Regional Costs Per Pupil

Costs

- A state aid dollar on Long Island buys far less than in other regions of the state. The purchasing power of \$1,000 in the lowest cost region (North Country) is the equivalent of \$883 in the cost region at the median (Central New York) and only \$668 on Long Island (see Table 9).
- Long Island's regionally adjusted per pupil expense (\$10,017) was approximately 6.6% below Putnam (\$10,727), the county at the median (see Table 12).
- Over the past ten years, Long Island has experienced an average 2% increase annually in per pupil expenditures. The annual average percentage point increase for counties at the median was approximately 3.2% (see Table 13).
- Long Island experienced an average annual enrollment growth of 1.8% over the past 10 years. Enrollment in the rest of the state was essentially unchanged (0.24%) during that same period of time (see Table 14).

Regional Salaries

- The mean (average) salary for an elementary school teacher on Long Island is \$67,370, which is within 0.3% of the statewide average of \$67,180, the statewide average includes New York City pay rates (see Table 10).
- The mean (average) salary for a middle school teacher on Long Island is \$68,570, which is within 2.3% of the statewide average of \$67,020; the statewide average includes New York City pay rates (see Table 10).
- The mean (average) salary for a secondary school teacher on Long Island is \$69,500, which is within 0.9% of the statewide average of \$68,850; the statewide average includes New York City pay rates (see Table 10).
- Average wages for teachers on Long Island are comparable to wages in a wide variety of non-education occupations (see Table 11).

The Suffolk County School Superintendents Association (SCSSA) continues to work with the Long Island Association (LIA) and the Nassau County Council of School Superintendents (NCCSS) to prepare specific recommendations to address our concerns about the Foundation Formula. Recommendations related to the "Regional Cost Index", "Sharing Ratio", and wealth measures will be prepared and promoted by the organizations.

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2007-08 Suffolk County School Funding Facts: Foundation Aid & High Tax Aid

The following facts related to Suffolk County school funding are based upon an analysis of data from the 2007-08 Property Tax Report Cards and school aid estimates published by New York State. The data is presented in the attached tables.

Regional information concerning costs, salaries, and local effort are drawn from the 2006 Long Island Association (LIA) publication, *Innovate* Long Island and associated research. All references to "Tables" and "Appendices" in the bullets refer to this publication, which is available on the Eastern Suffolk BOCES website at www.esboces.org

2007-08 School Funding

Last year Suffolk County school districts received approximately a \$60 million increase in Foundation Aid and a \$40 million increase in High Tax Aid. If as proposed by the Board of Regents, High Tax Aid is eliminated, and the 3% minimum increase in Foundation Aid is cut to 2%, Suffolk County school districts could lose nearly \$45 million this year.

SUCH A LOSS WOULD BE DISASTROUS FOR CHILDREN AND THE TAXPAYERS OF SUFFOLK COUNTY. HIGH TAX AID MUST BE RETAINED.

The Foundation Formula "didn't work" for 42 of 65* school districts in Suffolk County. Those districts received the 3% minimum increase in Foundation Aid because other variables within the formula did not generate an increase. Among those 42 school districts are 9 which were below the state average for wealth, enrolling nearly 66,000 students.

The 23 school districts that received an increase in Foundation Aid above the 3% minimum are both high and low wealth. Just under one-half (11) had a combined wealth ratio below 1.0 while the other 12 were all above 1.0.

THE FOUNDATION FORMULA MUST BE FIXED.

The establishment of High Tax Aid was critically important to all school districts but especially those that received the minimum increase in Foundation Aid.

TWO-THIRDS (44) OF SUFFOLK COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICTS RECEIVED A GREATER INCREASE IN HIGH TAX AID THAN IN FOUNDATION AID.

Only three districts in the County (Brentwood, William Floyd, and Wyandanch) receive a state share of funding over 50% of the budget. Nearly one-third of all districts (21) receive less than 10% of their budget in state aid. Another one-third (22) receive between 10% and 30% of their budget in state aid.

WE CONTINUE TO ADVOCATE FOR A MINIMUM STATE SHARE OF FUNDING FOR ALL DISTRICTS.

- Within the Foundation Formula, increases in aid for special education services were capped. Expense-driven excess cost aid in the amount of \$193 million was incorporated in the base Foundation Aid. Traditionally, increases in aid tied to increasing costs for these mandated services were provided to districts; their increases are now capped within the formula.
- The total enrollment of the 65 school districts in the County is 261,252. This includes 20 school districts with a combined wealth ratio below the state average (1.0). Enrollment in these districts is 131,620, or 50% of all students in the County.

THE PERCEPTION OF WEALTH ON LONG ISLAND CONTINUES TO DIFFER FROM THE REALITY.

Local Effort/Disposable Income

- A Long Island worker earning the regional median wage, purchasing a median-priced home and financing that house over 30 years, has far less disposable income than wage earners in the other regions of the state.
 - Disposable income for a Long Island median wage homeowner is less than 1% of wages earned. Disposable income for such workers in other regions range from 14% to 57% of the median wage. (This calculation does not include the cost of property taxes.)
- Long Islanders use an average of about 20% more of their gross household incomes to pay their residential school property taxes than New Yorkers in general (see Appendix D).
 - As Long Island's regionally adjusted per pupil expenditures are approximately 6.6% less than those for New York State, this greater than average effort is required due to Long Island's share of state aid (see Table 12 and Appendix D).
- STAR subsidies to certain residential property owners on Long Island amounted to nearly \$641 million. If these STAR subsidies had been paid directly to school districts in the form of state aid, the amount of funds that school districts needed to raise from local property taxes and other revenues would have decreased by nearly \$641 million or more than 11%. STAR subsidies provide no school tax relief for commercial property owners (see Table 16).

Regional Costs Per Pupil

<u>Costs</u>

- A State aid dollar on Long Island buys far less than in other regions of the State. The purchasing power of \$1,000 in the lowest cost region (North Country) is the equivalent of \$883 in the cost region at the median (Central New York), and only \$668 on Long Island (see Table 9).
- Long Island's regionally adjusted per pupil expense (\$10,017) was approximately 6.6% below Putnam (\$10,727), the county at the median (see Table 12).
- Over the past ten years, Long Island has experienced an average 2 percentage point increase annually in per pupil expenditures. The annual average percentage point increase for counties at the median was approximately 3.2 percentage points (see Table 13).
- Long Island experienced an average annual enrollment growth of 1.8% over the past 10 years.
 Enrollment in the rest of the State was essentially unchanged (0.24%) during that same period of time (see Table 14).

Regional Salaries

- The mean (average) salary for an elementary school teacher on Long Island is \$67,370, which is within 0.3% of the statewide average of \$67,180; the statewide average includes New York City pay rates (see Table 10).
- The mean (average) salary for a middle school teacher on Long Island is \$68,570, which is within 2.3% of the statewide average of \$67,020; the statewide average includes New York City pay rates (see Table 10).
- The mean (average) salary for a secondary school teacher on Long Island is \$69,500, which is within 0.9% of the statewide average of \$68,850; the statewide average includes New York City pay rates (see Table 10).
- Average wages for teachers on Long Island are comparable to wages in a wide variety of noneducation occupations (see Table 11).

The Suffolk County School Superintendents Association (SCSSA) continues to work with the Long Island Association (LiA) and the Nassau County Council of School Superintendents (NCCSS) to prepare specific recommendations to address our concerns about the Foundation Formula. Recommendations related to the "Regional Cost Index", "Sharing Ratio", and wealth measures will be prepared and promoted by the organizations.
