70% of the building level costs are salary and benefits, which involve no "methodology" or "rationale" since they are controlled by contract, as is the movement of teachers between buildings. Student population make up drives other personnel / spending decisions at the building level. If a student requires special services (IEP related services, physical accommodations, individualized transportation, special meal requirements) we provide them. "School –level funding determinations" is a misnomer. We do not allocate discretionary funds by building – we allocate them based on individual student needs. For example, we do not know where ELL students are going to show up so regardless of what budget assumptions we make at what building, we spend as required per regulation regardless of building.
