Total funding allocated to individual schools was done in one of three ways:

- A. Where applicable, any budgeted amounts that were accounted for at a specific school location, either in the account string itself or in the description entered, were allocated to that school site. This includes salary amounts that were allocated to specific school sites based on teacher placement data available at the time of reporting.
- B. If no school location was specified but a particular level was (e.g. elementary or secondary salaries), the budgeted amounts were allocated to the school sites by total enrollment in the relevant grade bands.
- C. If no school location nor level was specified, the budgeted amount was allocated across all school locations by total enrollment.
